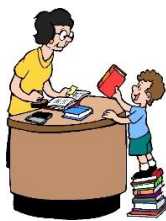
The foreign languages department is excited to open our annual "Foreign Language Week" poster contest to the ENTIRE school, NOT just foreign language classes. This year's national foreign

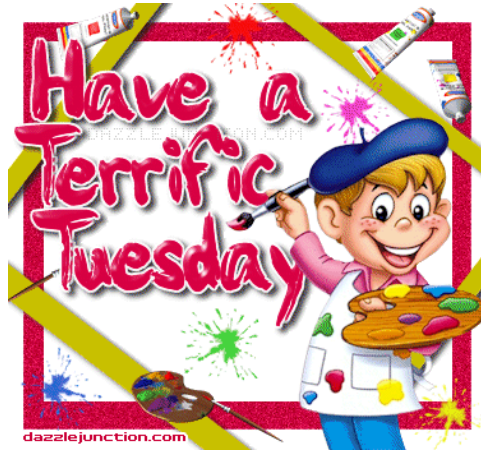
Have you ever engaged in community service in a different country? Are you interested in traveling to the Dominican Republic to immerse yourself in culture for a week
